Maximizing Esports Streams



Situation

- Divisive comments and personal attacks have increased during live esports streams.
- The offensive rhetoric is frustrating and painful, and impacting the team's ability to engage positively with fellow gamers.
- We commend our team members for their efforts to deal with these challenging situations.
- Need to take a collective look at the techniques developed to help navigate these types of disruptions and violations.



Objective

Support Navy streamers and moderators with **technique-driven**, **message-centered** tools for maximizing Twitch livestream opportunities and minimizing the disruptive behavior of others.

Ignore and Play On

- While difficult, the best approach is to simply ignore disruptive individuals.
- Situation will escalate if you engage with someone who is there only to disrupt.
- No reason to draw additional attention to disruptive individual.
- Let the moderators control the chat. If an individual continues to bully, harass, personally attack or spam, the moderator will take the appropriate action.



Ignore and Play On

- Control your reaction and convey a sense of Navy calm.
- Focus on the most important audience.
- Take back the attention of your viewers and pull their eyes from chat to the game.
- Reference anything relatable/funny/engaging that will pull attention away from the chat and back on you.
- Create a go-to list of topics to pull from when you see something in chat that frustrates or angers you: movies, which consoles you prefer, pop culture, etc.
- Create a relationship with your viewers based on your own experiences and personality.



If You Must Respond

Attempt to use one of these four, general responses:

- "I am here to hang out with people like me who love gaming. If you want to know more about my life in the Navy, I am happy to discuss. But I will not speak on behalf of others."
- "I understand that some people here oppose the military and have no interest in a Navy career. But for those who are curious about what it's like to serve, let's talk."
- "If you have concerns about Navy policies or actions, I suggest you contact the Federal Elected Officials from your state."
- "I'm here to play games. I have no interest in engaging in personal attacks."

Bridging (Transitioning)

- "I can't really speak to that but what I can tell you..."

Flagging (Emphasizing)

- "The most important thing is..."
- "The bottom line is..."
- "If you remember one thing it should be..."
- "For me, the biggest issue..."



Message Control

Bridging (Transitioning)

- "I don't have access to that data, but I can tell you about my personal experience with that issue."
- "I can't really speak to that, but if you have any tips on the game I'm playing, let me know."

Flagging (Emphasizing)

- "The bottom line is, I am here to hang out with people like me who love gaming."
- "If you remember one thing, it should be that sailors are just like everyone else."



Message Map

- What does your typical day look like?
- Do you have any pets or siblings or funny stories to share?



Share your decision to join the Navy

- When did you decide to join the Navy?
- What motivated you?
- Did anyone in your family serve in the Navy or military?
- How did your family react to your decision?
- How did your friends react to the decision?
- What were you most excited about?
- What were your biggest fears?
- Did you know what Navy career path you wanted to pursue?



Share stories about your Navy adventure

- How long have you been in the Navy?
- What was your job before joining Goats & Glory?
- What training did you receive?
- How do esports relate to Navy life?
- Where have you traveled?
- What ships have served? What's it like to live on a ship?
- What was the most fun you've ever had in the Navy?
- What was your greatest Navy adventure?
- How has your life been changed by the Navy?
- Have you taken advantage of Navy education reimbursement opportunities?
- What is your life like outside of the Navy?

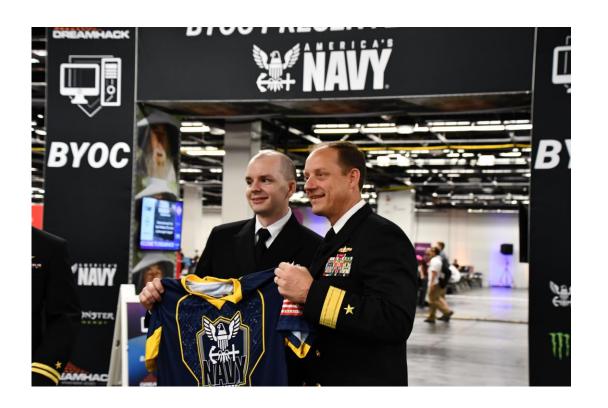


Do

• Bring Energy

Get excited and remain positive throughout the stream

- 30-Second Rule
 Aim to talk every 30-seconds to boost stream engagement
- Explain Gameplay
 Talk out loud about what you see and the moves you make –
 your game commentary adds value and engages viewers
- Utilize Your Personal Commentary Arsenal
 Identify topics to discuss prior to each streaming session



Don't

- Don't read negative chats out-loud
- Don't use explicit, derogatory or sarcastic language
- Don't berate, belittle, or engage with lurkers within the chat
